Bicentennial Birthday Celebration of Pandit Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar

Bicentennial birthday Celebration of Pandit Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar has been organized by Visva-Bharati Library Network (Central Library), Visva-Bharati on 26th September 2019. The program started with a rally from Upasana-griha to Central Library, Visva-Bharati at 8.30am.

There was an Exhibition of Books on/by Vidyasagar alongwith the short sketch of his life has been arranged in front of the library near Circulation Desk and the audience appreciated the initiative after visiting the same.

The program was formally inaugurated at Conference Hall of the Central Library by floral tribute to great thinkers of the Nation both Pandit Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar and Rabindrantah Tagore, which followed with Vedic Mantras and Welcome song by the students of Patha Bhavana. Prof Nirmalya Banerjee, Prof-in-Charge, University Library has delivered the welcome address. Then Prof. Amal Kumar Pal, Department of Bengali and Director (Acting), Culture and Cultural Relations, Rabindra Bhavana, Visva-Bharati has delivered invited speech on "Vidyasagar in the eye of Rabindranath" (রবীন্দ্র দৃষ্টিতে বদ্বিযাসাগর). He gave an illuminated insight into the lives of Rabindranath Tagore and Vidyasagar, his in-depth research on the topic unveiled many untold stories about the two pioneers of modern Bengal. His lecture was overwhelmed by the audience and made everyone speechless. Then, presidential and thought-provoking lecture has been delivered by Prof. Bidyut Chakrabarty, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Visva-Bharati, where he praised the lecture of Prof. Amal Pal and initiatives of the VBLN. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor also ignited the young minds for progressive development. His inspiring thoughts and initiatives showed the way for further progress of the University. Lastly, vote of thanks has been delivered by Smt. Sabahat Nausheen, Asst. Librarian (Stage - II) and In-charge Rabindra Bhavana Library. Around 165 participants have witnessed the event.

Web Online Public Access Catalogue (WebOPAC) (Library Catalogues on the Web)

OPAC is an online catalogue facility that enables speedy searching of library database including books, journals, periodicals and manuscripts spread over all libraries under Visva-Bharati Library System. OPAC terminals are available in the libraries wherefrom databases could be accessed. The WebOPAC (OPAC on the Internet) facilitates access to OPAC from anywhere, anytime through the Library website (<http://172.16.2.132/library>).

First one has to login by clicking 'My Account' with ID (**library card number** of the individual user) and password (setting by you). On any problem or to insert own password then click on forgot password and put **library card number** and registered e-mail then system will send password change link through the said mail ID.

I. Books (inclusive of Digitized Books): Searchable by a) Browse, b) Simple Search, c) Advanced Search, d) Accession Number and e) ISBN

[Digitized-books are distinguished by the PDF Icon  clicking on which the content of the book(s) will open]

a. Browse: All books are listed alphabetically by fields like author, title etc.

➤ Select 'Books' and/or 'E-Books' from 'Database'.

➤ Select the field (like author, title) from the 'Displaying' box, enter few initial alphabets of the title or author (as the case may be) at 'Starting with' box, and click 'go'. It retrieves the available bibliographic information (information about the book(s)) called Catalogue.

➤ Click on the desired catalogue for full details that will be displayed on extreme right column (in two formats). If the book in question is not available (issued/in bindery etc), it will be so displayed at the RHS bottom. If issued to someone, the name and due date will be displayed. Accession numbers with 'Ref' attached would mean these are reference books and available at reference section which is/are not issuable.

Prefixes like PV, VB, RB etc. are used to indicate in which library the book is stacked / located / housed. However, books available in Central Library will bear no prefix (For details see the Table below).

▪ Note down the details especially 'Call No.' and 'Accession No.' to locate the book at the rack of the Central Library or concerned Bhavana or Seminar / Departmental. Library. Provision for 'Download' is also provided at the bottom. Do it after chosen 'Select' from the 'Mode' (i.e change the 'Mode' given on top from 'view' to 'select') drop down window at the top. It will help to collate a bibliography for future study.

For Bengali books turn on the Avro key layout and use Avro Mouse and type.

Result: 1) Browse:-

Use browsing option to scan alphabetically arranged indices / catalogues for author, title, publisher, place of conference, subject, etc. Enter the initial character of the required word and click at 'Go' to position the catalogue on the display screen. One can find the location of the books, journals etc. from the display screen. Browse is the best option especially if a user does not have complete name of author, title, etc. The following catalogue / indices are available for browsing:

Author Catalogue, Title Catalogue, Classified Catalogue, Subject Catalogue

LIBSYS (the library automation software) would respond by displaying a page consisting brief list and detail list of the first ten entries starting with the specified subject-giving no. of titles under each subject. The list of titles under a particular subject can further be seen by clicking a particular entry on the brief list.

b) Simple Search

- Select 'Books' from 'Database'.
- Select specific field like author, title etc. or 'any filed' (*selection of 'any field' expands the search result*)
- Enter word(s) or phrase in the 'Search word(s)' box. If the search term contains more than one word, use AND, OR from the dropdown list called 'Connect word(s)'. (AND and OR function here as Boolean operators*). In case the search term is a phrase select 'PHRASE' from the 'Connect word(s)' box.
- Specify year(s) of publication.
- Sort by... or unsorted
- Click 'Go'

Result: 1) Retrieves all records as per the search parameters set by you. 2) Full catalogue of selected title can be seen on Right Hand Side (RHS) in various formats 3) Click on the 'Next' term at the bottom to see the subsequent pages (if any) (Every page contains 10 titles).

Click on the desired catalogue for details that will be displayed on extreme right column (in two formats). If the book in question is not available (issued/in bindery etc.), it will be so displayed at the RHS bottom. If issued to someone, the name and due date will be displayed (on clicking on the accession no.). Accession numbers with 'R' attached would mean these are reference books and not issuable.

Note down the details especially 'Call No.' and locate the book at the rack. Provision for 'Download' is also provided at the bottom. Do it after having chosen 'Select' from the 'Mode' drop down window at the top.

c) Advanced Search

Facilitates refining the search using a combination of search fields by applying Boolean search operators*(AND, OR, NOT)

- Select 'Books' from 'Database'.
- Select specific field for each search term like author, title etc. or 'any filed' (selection of 'any field' expands the search result).
- Enter word(s) or phrase in 'Search word(s)' boxes. Select AND, OR, PHRASE from the 'Connect words as' box. (This acts on the immediately preceding 'search keyword(s)' box). Select Boolean search operators AND, OR, NOT. (It acts on the immediately preceding and following 'search keyword(s)' box).
- Specify year(s) of publication.

- Sort by... or unsorted.

- Click 'Go'

Result: 1) Retrieves all records as per the search parameters set by you, 2) Books under process (which are not catalogued and not ready for issuing) can also be seen with a mark '[BS]' or 'Tec. Proc.' (This is a way to inform the indenter that the book has arrived). 3) Full catalogue of selected title can be seen on RHS in various formats 4) Click on the 'Next' term at the bottom to see the subsequent pages (if any) (Every page contains 10 titles).

Click on the desired catalogue for details that will be displayed on extreme right column (in two formats). If the book in question is not available (issued/in bindery etc.), it will be so displayed at the RHS bottom. If issued to someone, the name and due date will be displayed. Accession numbers with 'R' attached would mean these are reference books and not issuable

- Note down the details especially 'Call No.' and locate the book at the rack. Provision for 'Download/Mail' is also provided at the bottom. Do it after having chosen 'Select' from the 'Mode' drop down window at the top.

d) Accession Number: Enter Accession No. of the book concerned and make search.

e) ISBN: Enter ISBN (International Standard Book No.) of the book concerned and make search. (*Case of known books. Will indicate status of the book.*)

I. E-Books

Select the database by clicking (RHS) and then Search or Browse like the books as given above. Click on the hyperlink of URL to open the book.

II. CD- ROMs

Select the database by clicking (RHS) Search or Browse. Browsing be done preferably by title.

III. Theses & Dissertations

Select the database by clicking (RHS) Search or Browse.

IV. New Arrivals

Provides a list of newly added books (last 30 days) at the Library

V. Journals Browse

Provides information about each journal, current and old, including availability of each issue. Click on the journal of your interest. First part will show the list of loose issues and the latter info. on bound volumes prefixed with 'B'

VI. Check Out History

Click on the My A/C, enter the Library Card number as ID and your setting password and click on 'Sign in' to see your account viz., the checkout/check in and reservation history.

VII. External Database

Click on External Links (RHS) for see the External databases

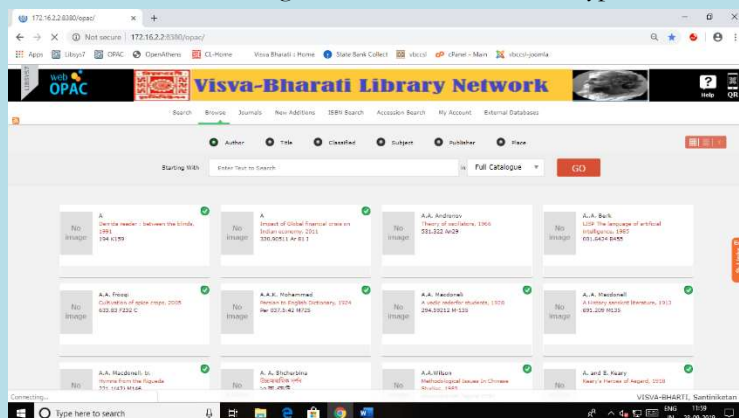
*Boolean Search Operators

AND: Narrows search and retrieves records containing *all* of the words it separates.

OR: Broadens search and retrieves records containing any of the words it separates.

NOT: Narrows search and retrieves records that does not contain the term following it.
