Explore the right perspective on India

Based on the usage and to fulfill the ever increasing requirements of the library users, Visva-Bharati Library Network has increased access facility to Indiastat.com from three-user to five-user with effect from April 1, 2021. It is an India's most comprehensive e-resource socio-economic data. This may also be accessible through remote access i.e. LsDiscovery (https://vbu.lsdiscovery.in/).

Indiastat.com serves with authentic and perhaps the most comprehensive compilation of secondary level socioeconomic statistical information about India and its states on various socioeconomic parameters. These parameters are General Information, Demographics, Economy, Agriculture, Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs, Environment and Forest, Industries, Infrastructure, Companies, Education, Health, Housing, Labour and Workforce, Polity, Media, Insurance, Tourism, Crime & Law, Social Welfare and Development Schemes, etc. Indiastat.com provides secondary level socioeconomic Statistical Information about India, its states, regions, and sectors.

It is an initiative of Datanet India Pvt. Ltd. was launched on 14 November, 2000. It is a gateway to comprehensive and authentic socio-economic information related to India. This web portal provides well compiled and ready to use India-specific socio-economic statistical information called out from various authentic secondary sources. Indiastat.com is a cluster of 56 sites including 19 sectors-specific and 31 India/State/UTs specific sites, and 6 Regional specific sites. Over half-a-million pages of statistical data have been qualitatively analysed, condensed and presented in a user-friendly format on the portal. The socio-economic statistical data has been categorized in more than 35 classifications and further sub-divided into various sub-categories.

This exhaustive compilation of data can easily be accessed in three or four clicks and can be searched for any fact or figure. The data can be downloaded in MSExcel/HTML formats. Researchers, students and faculty of Visva-Bharati can easily access the database covering all major parameters for research, study, review and reference purposes. Information available online can be used by them as per their need and discretion. With over 5,00,000 comprehensive pages on the net, the site covers wide ranging topics like agriculture, demographics, market forecast, health, media, economy, crime, social welfare etc.

Visva-Bharati can access indiastat.com by IP login which implies that you are on the university network or LsDiscovery while you log in.

Please Note:


- i) The access is restricted five-user at a time. In case you fail to get access, kindly wait for your turn.
- ii) Log –in is required for downloading only.

How to start

- ✓ Users can start navigating for data available on the site through any of the following three different ways: By clicking on IP Login on the toolbar at home page (indiastat.com) (Log –in is required only if you download)
- ✓ By navigating the site through the section "Statistical Information" available on the left panel on its home page, and
- ✓ By searching the data on site through the "Search" box given on its home page.

Where to login

✓ It is advisable to start navigating the site by logging-in as suggested below: Click on the IP Login option (shown prominently on the tool bar) on home page, as shown in the adjacent figure.



Navigation for data

- ✓ Whether logged in or not, click the requisite Data Category, under "Statistical Information" shown on the left panel.
- ✓ You get on screen the alphabetical list of its sub-categories. Clicking a sub-category will lead you to a further sub-category or to the list of data table headings pertaining to the sub-category clicked.
- ✓ The page showing data table heading shows you data at India level or State-wise or Region-wise consolidated data. Click on any State/Union Territory/ Region name, would further take you to the data table listing page, for the clicked State/Union Territory. Region, under the said heading.
- ✓ Click the table heading to view the data table that will be shown in a separate window.
- ✓ In case not logged in, the following window would appear asking you to log in thru home page.
- ✓ Once the data table is displayed, you may download the data table in MS-Excel, MS-Word or HTML format and/or print the table, subject to the rights assigned with your access.




Searching the data available on site Data can be search on site thru the "Search" box shown prominently below the top tool bar. The data available, relating to the keyword or phrase submitted by you would appear as search result in the form of a list of data table headings. By click any table heading to view the data by following the instruction given in Para 'Navigating for Data' above.

Time-out period

Time-out period of browser is 20 minutes. Thereafter, re-log in would be required.

Access through Remote Access: Indiastat also accessible through remote access (LsDiscovery), only requirement is to login of remote access by using Library Card No. as ID & vbu123 as password and rest steps/ methods are similar as mentioned above.

ICAR has established various research centres in order to meet the agricultural research and education needs of the country. It is actively pursuing human resource development in the field of agricultural sciences by setting up numerous agricultural universities spanning the entire country.
