

Visva-Bharati Digital Library (VBDL)

Visva-Bharati Library Network has launched its digital library service during the pandemic. It is open to all at free of cost and is accessible from anywhere through any network. It is operated and maintained by Visva-Bharati Library Network (VBNL) and accessible through the URL: https://vbudspace.lsdiscovery.in/xmlui/.

VBDL is a virtual repository of learning resources which mainly focuses on materials created or held by the Visva-Bharati community. Particularly, it is a home of collected materials of Visva-Bharati's scholarly publications, project reports, question papers, newsletter, annual report, etc. and serves as a centralized repository. The aim of the VBDL is to provide an effective means to distribute learning resources to students and other users.

It is a collection of digital / digitized documents consisting of accessible collections of scholarly publications that represent the intellectual assets of an institution. Visva-Bharati Library Network has developed its digital library (institutional repository) using dspace open source digital library software to manage the digitized documents their communities produce, maximize access to research outputs both preprint and post print publications and also to increase the visibility and academic prestige of both the institution and authors. However, Visva-Bharati Library Network was managing its IR using the Joomla open source content management software since 2011, when research publications have been shared to library for uploading on Visva-Bharati website.



Aims and objectives:

Authors may get citation based on the details of the original publication without hampering copyright issues. The download of full text from outside the campus is being restricted but, they can access using password communicated amongst users. Sometimes, VB fraternity may not be aware about some publications of his/her colleagues and scholars and for which they need to pay to the publishers or else to have the accessibility of the full text of one particular publication. This initiative may remove that kind of limitation and indirectly enhance the interdisciplinary research. Thus, it is helpful to both author/contributor of the publication as well as colleagues and scholars of the institute being users.

Communities and collections:

Presently, one community namely "Visva-Bharati Digital Library" has been created and under this community seven collections have been created. It covers the Faculty / Staff / Scholars Publication, Project / Technical Report, Question Papers, Syllabus, VB-Annual Report, VBLN e-Newsletter, and VBLN-Annual Report. A total of 5139 full-text pdf files under the different collections have been uploaded in the digital library as on 30th November 2021.

Key Features

- * Filtered and federated searching is employed to facilitate focused searching so that learners can find the right resource with least effort and in minimum time

Browse: Browse allows you to go through a list of items in some specified order.

- **Browse by Community / Collection** takes you through the communities in alphabetical order and allows you to see the sub-communities and collections within each community.
- **Browse by Issue Date** allows you to move through a list of all items in DSpace in ascending order.
- **Browse by Author** allows you to move through an alphabetical list of all authors of items in DSpace.
- **Browse by Title** allows you to move through an alphabetical list of all titles of items in DSpace.
- **Browse by Subject** allows you to move through an alphabetical list of subjects assigned to items in DSpace.

Search: To search all of DSpace, use the yellow search box at the top of the navigation bar on the left (or the search box in the



middle of the home page). To limit your search to a specific community or collection, navigate to that community or collection and use the search bar on that page. What is searched in the general keyword search box. The word(s) you enter in the search box will be searched against the title, author, subject. Stop Words, the search engine ignores certain words that occur frequently in English, but do not add value to the search. These are: "a", "and", "are", "as", "at", "be", "but", "by", "for", "if", "in", "into", "is", "it", "no", "not", "of", "on", "or", "such", "the", "to", "was". Users can also use "Truncation Search" an asterisk (*) after a word stem to get all hits having words starting with that root, Phrase Searching, and Boolean searching.

Advanced search: The advanced search option allows to specify the fields you wish to search, and to combine these searches with the Boolean "and", "or" or "not".

You can restrict your search to a community by clicking on the arrow to the

right of the top box. If you want your search to encompass all of DSpace, leave that box in the default position. Then select the field to search in the left-hand column and enter the word or phrase you are searching in the right hand column. You can select the Boolean operator to combine searches by clicking on the arrow to the right of the "AND" box.

My Account: When anyone accesses an area of DSpace that requires authorization, the system will require you to log in. All users



can register to become subscribers. Some restricted functions, such as content submission, require authorization from the community.

Before you log in for the first time, you will need to click on "register with DSpace" and follow the instructions. After that, you will need to enter your e-mail address and password in the log-in form that appears.

- ❖ Your e-mail address should include your username and domain name. It is not case sensitive.
- ❖ Type your password exactly as you entered it originally. It is case sensitive. Be sure to click on the "log in" button to continue.

However, this 'My Account' facility has not been opened yet for general users of the Visva-Bharati Library Network. Presently, Visva-Bharati Library Network is using only the administrative account to create and develop the digital library. But soon it will be open for Visva-Bharati fraternity for uploading their digital documents at their side by 'log-in' DSpace using their allotted ID & Password.

Discover: Likewise the browse, it will also allows you to go through a list of items in some specified order.

- ❖ Discover by Author allows you to move through a list of all authors of items in DSpace displayed in order of relevance.
- ❖ Discover by Subject allows you to move through a list of subjects assigned to items in DSpace displayed in order of relevance.
- ❖ Discover by Date Issued allows you to move through a list of all items in DSpace displayed in order of relevance.
- ❖ Discover by Has File(s) Option yes, allows you to move through a list of all items in DSpace displayed in order of relevance.
