The DOAB (https://www.doabooks.org/en) is a community-driven discovery service that aids users in locating reputable open access book publishers while indexing and providing access to scholarly, peer-reviewed open access publications. All DOAB services are gratuitous, and all information is publicly accessible. DOAB's main goal is to make open access books more discoverable. Academic book publishers are encouraged to send DOAB the metadata for their open access works. An open infrastructure dedicated to open science is DOAB. It is powered by the DSpace 6 open source platform.

In close collaboration with the Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ) & SemperTool, the OAPEN Foundation launched the Directory of Open Access Books (DOAB) in 2012. The DOAB Foundation offers the Directory of Open Access Books as a service. The OAPEN Foundation and OpenEdition founded the DOAB Foundation, which is a nonprofit organisation (or "stichting") under Dutch law.

The Directory of Open Access Books (DOAB) is a discovery service for open access books. Peer-reviewed monographs and edited collections published under an open access licence are listed in a searchable index by DOAB, with links to the full texts of the publications at the publisher's website or repository. The DOAB strives to improve discoverability, maximise distribution, and increase awareness by serving as a trustworthy source for open access book metadata and publishers. By searching and browsing the directory, researchers can use DOAB to access free-to-read monographs and edited volumes.



The Directory of Open Access Books (DOAB) has about 63,000 academic peer-reviewed books in its collection from various important subjects like Interdisciplinary, Anthropology, Archaeology, Biology, Business, Business Technology Management, Chemistry and Biochemistry, Computer Science, Data and Statistics, Economics, Geography and Environmental Studies, Health Sciences, Health Studies, History, Languages and Literatures, Law and Society, Legal Information, Mathematics, Philosophy, Political Science. Access to this resource and to the books it links to is free to everyone ranging from 1960s to present.

DOAB provides the option to browse by publisher, which results in an alphabetical list of around 626 publishers, followed by the number of open access books which they have listed in DOAB. You can also browse by subject, to find publishers who work with authors in your field. If you are interested in a particular publisher, click on the link, and you will find the URL of their website and, in many cases, tabs with more information: 'about', 'peer review' and 'licence'. If you are looking for publishers in your language area, start by searching for a subject and then select the language area of your choice on the results page.

Accessing eBooks through the Directory of Open Access (DOAB): Getting started

Click the DOAB website at https://doabooks.org/ and will open website as Fig. 1. One can use Search if have a specific question otherwise use Browse to look at several books that are related in some way.




Fig: 2: Searching eBook

After clicking on the search tab as selected in the Fig: 2 an another window will open likewise Fig: 3 where in the left side of the windows, list of recently added e-books will be displayed under "Recently Added" and on the right side again search box will appear where search terms can be entered. At the bottom of this page there is an option of "View more". After clicking on this view more, list of all eBooks will be displayed under the page "DOAB PROD Instance: Recent submissions" and desired whole e-Books and Chapters can be downloaded.

If anyone types something in the Search box, the search engine looks in all fields. If anyone want to search on a specific field, such as Author or Publisher, use Advanced search.

Searching of e-Books performed by putting search term in the search box. Let's have an example "Agriculture". Put Agriculture in search box and press enter. A list of all eBooks on Agriculture will be displayed in Fig. 4. there is an option in gear icon, to Sort the search results in various ways likewise, relevance, Title ASC (title by ascending order), Title DESC (title by descending order), Issue Date ASC, Issue Date DESC. According to the convenience number of search result per page can also be changed from default 10 to 5, 10, 20, 40, 60, 80, 100. Export facility of bibliographic data of all the search result is also available just beside the gear icon.




Fig: 4: Search Result


Browse eBook

Browsing of eBooks can be performed by more than 2000 Subjects, 600+ publishers, more than 90 languages amongst the 16 different collections created by DOAB.

Sort the Browse subjects, Publishers; Languages are available in various ways like ascending and descending order. According to the users convenience number of search result per page can also be changed here likewise search facility from default 10 to 5, 10, 20, 40, 60, 80, 100. Export facility of bibliographic data of all the search results or for any specific individual title in specific formats is also available just beside the gear icon.

Selecting an individual title

Clicking on the desired title from the search result /browse lists, will provide the full bibliographical details about the selected eBooks with the full metadata record along with the download URL(s) as marked in the Fig. 5 to access the full-text likewise Fig. 6..






Fig: 5: Download URL(s)
