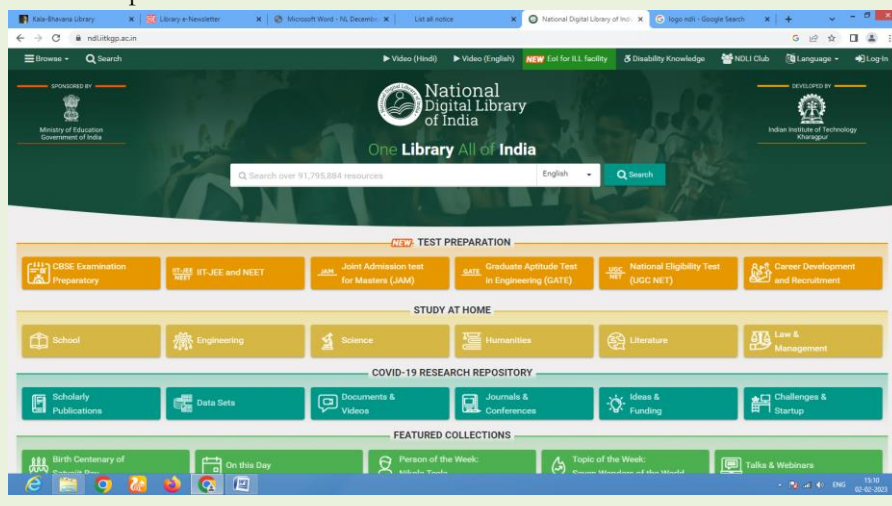
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National Digital Library of India (NDLI) (<https://ndl.iitkgp.ac.in/>) is a virtual repository of learning resources which is not just a repository with search/browse facilities but provides a host of services for the learner community. **Visva-Bharati is one of the sources of National Digital Library of India.**

Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) under its National Mission on Education through Information and Communication Technology has initiated the National Digital Library of India (NDL India) pilot project to develop a framework of virtual repository of learning resources with a single-window search facility. Filtered and federated searching is employed to facilitate focused searching so that learners can find out the right resource with least effort and in minimum time. NDL India is designed to hold content of any language and provides interface support for leading Indian languages (currently Hindi and Bengali). It is being arranged to provide support for all academic levels including researchers and life-long learners, all disciplines, all popular form of access devices and differently-abled learners. It is being developed to help students to prepare for entrance and competitive examination, to enable people to learn and prepare from best practices from all over the world and to facilitate researchers to perform inter-linked exploration from multiple sources.



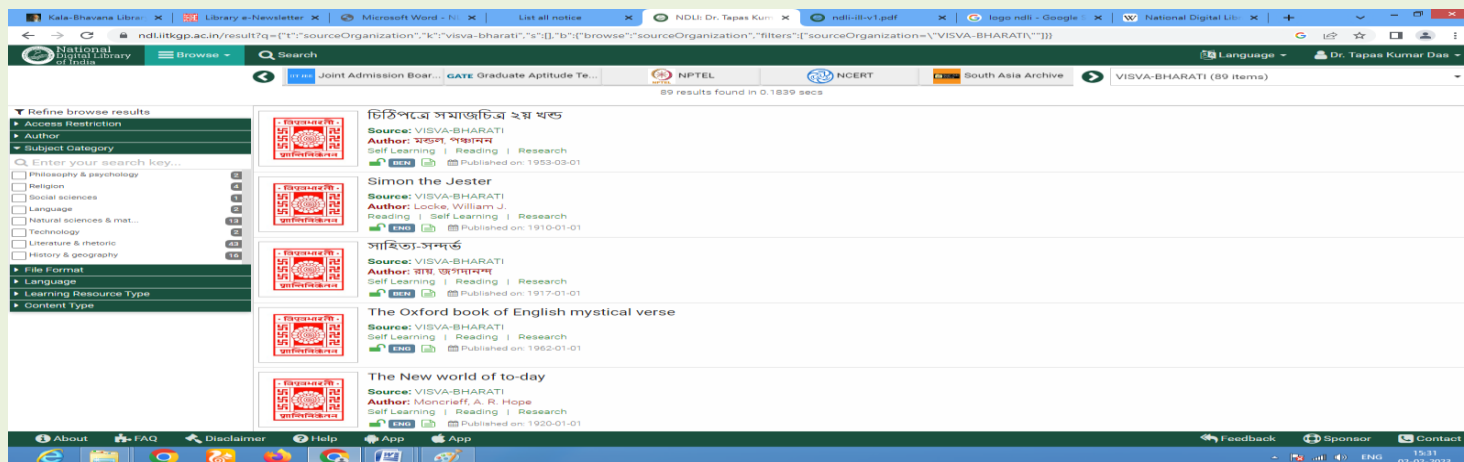
It is an all-digital library that stores information (metadata) about different types of digital contents including books, articles, videos, audios, thesis and other educational materials relevant for users from varying educational levels and capabilities. It provides a single window search facility to access digital contents currently existing in India as well as other digital sources under a single umbrella.

An individual or institute can simply type in the URL (<https://ndl.iitkgp.ac.in>) into a common web browser to access the NDL India system. The NDL India system is accessible to all users for general browsing. However, one needs to register with a user ID and password and login using those for accessing the full contents of any item. Once you have typed in the URL (<https://ndl.iitkgp.ac.in>) of NDL India and land on the Homepage of NDL India, you will find a window on the right hand side saying 'Member Log-in'. Click on the 'Register' button whereby a registration form will open up. Fill up all the details on the form and submit. One will soon get a validation link in your mailbox. Click the link and validate and then you can start using NDL India.

From next time onwards, please use the login button on the Home page for accessing NDL India. It is also accessible on mobile devices as well using a common web browser. Right now, it is active for Android operating system and will soon be launched for IOS and Windows operating system as well. Access to the NDL India system is free of charge. However, this will lead the user to the materials which may reside on other institutions' servers. Accessing these will be determined by the policy of those institutions and their access rules. View of the documents, full text or not, is controlled by the source organization.

While many organizations are happy to provide full text access to all their documents, many would like to restrict and want the user to either log in or send a request directly to an email ID provided on the site for full text. There can be some publishers, like Springer, who would want to sale a copy of the document while there can be some other documents which are free of cost when accessed through NDL India log in but will cost if accessed from some other site. There is an icon beside each document to tell upfront about the access rights of the document. Information can be personalized based on the education level, choice of language, difficulty level, media of content and such other factors while other Digital libraries may not include all these choices. This is like a 'customised service' provided in a 24x7 integrated environment to suit a user's requirement and will be like a one-stop shop for all digital resources. The ultimate aim is to provide the materials in all vernacular languages. However, this will very much depend on the actual availability of materials in the vernacular. NDL India can accommodate materials in any language while the User Interface for Browsing and Searching has been launched with the languages Hindi, English and Bengali and is slowly being expanded to include other languages. One can refine his/her search criteria from the 'Refine search results' facet by choosing different options like Author, Subject, Learning Resource Type etc. This will help to retrieve an item meeting multiple selection criterion. Even one can use the 'Advanced Search' option placed on the top right side of the screen to apply multiple selection criteria (Source, Educational level, Language, Learning Resource Type) for a more focused and faster search. The option to save or download an article will depend on the access rights provided by the content provider. Once saved, printing can be done. Sometimes, there could be a limit to the number of pages that can be printed (e.g. upto 100 pages). Once again, this will vary from document to document based on the access rights set by the content owner. Any one may contribute articles to include in NDL India. Some Recent Library Activities / Developments:

- **Two-Day Special Session:** Visva-Bharati Library Network has successfully organized two special sessions in Physical mode during 30-31 January 2023. The sessions have been arranged to enable stakeholders to better use the Research Tool to enhance the quality of research output and to explore the expertise by registering in the VIDWAN & IRINS database. Topics covered during the session are 1) **Issues on Plagiarism** and Similarity Checking by using OURIGINAL by **Dr. Nimai Chand Saha**, University Librarian (Acting); and 2) **Zotero: The Open Source Reference Management Software** by **Sri Ajay Kumar Sharma**, Assistant Librarian (Stage-III), **Cheena Bhavana Library**. The number of participants on the first day was sixty-two (62) and sixty-four (64) on the second day. Participants were pleased to attend both sessions and opined that the sessions were helpful for their research work. Participants are also pleased to request to arrange similar types of program in future to support research and academic activities.

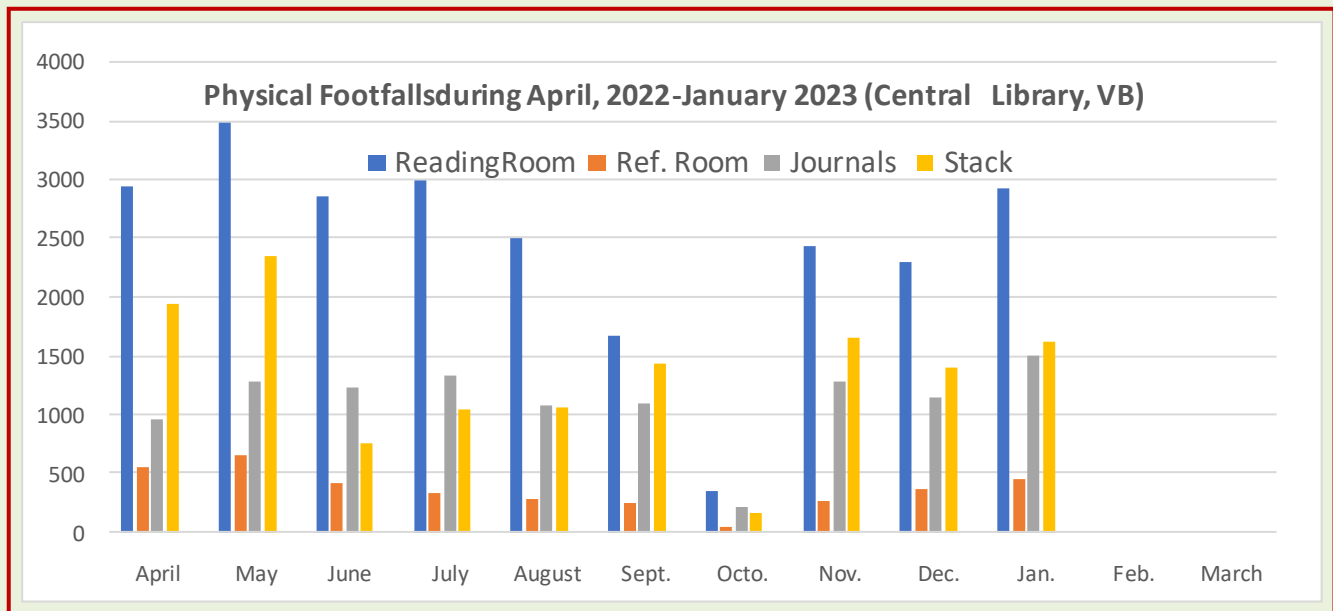
