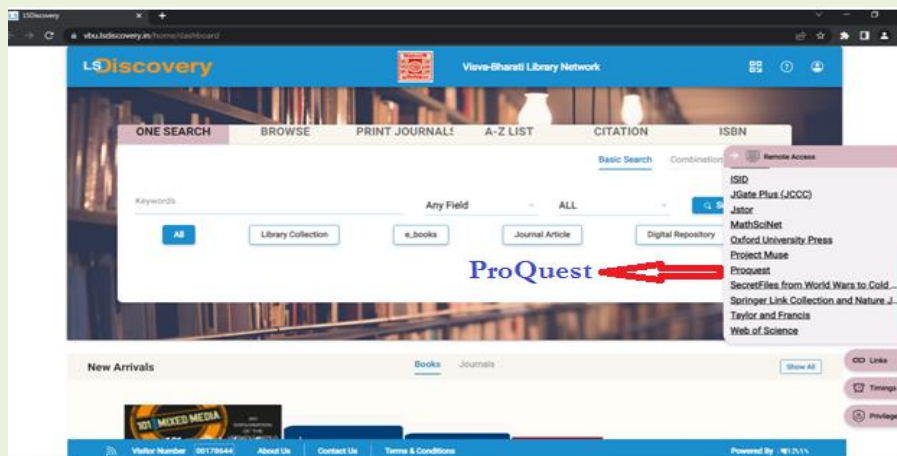


ProQuest: a global leader in EdTech (<https://www.proquest.com/>)

The ProQuest is a single search engine for four databases namely Journals, Books, academic Audio Video and Theses as well as dissertations. Free access to ProQuest for the users of Visva-Bharati Library is provided. **To access ProQuest**, users have to log on *Visva-Bharati Library website* (<http://visva-bharati-library.in/>) and then click on *Remote Access* to connect with sub menu *ProQuest*.

The ProQuest platform makes hundreds of full text and A&I (Abstracts & Indexes) collections available to researchers around the world. The ProQuest platform hosts multidisciplinary content containing scholarly journals, books, video & audio, dissertations & theses, newspapers and more. In addition, researchers will benefit from robust information management and workflow tools and functionality integrated into the platform, like the ability to cite results in numerous citation styles, save as a PDF or other document formats, save searches, and export documents to reference management tools like RefWorks.

From enabling researchers to mine vast amounts of data or automate reference support and document management, to facilitating the most laser-focused search and discovery on its award-winning platforms, ProQuest is committed to research excellence.



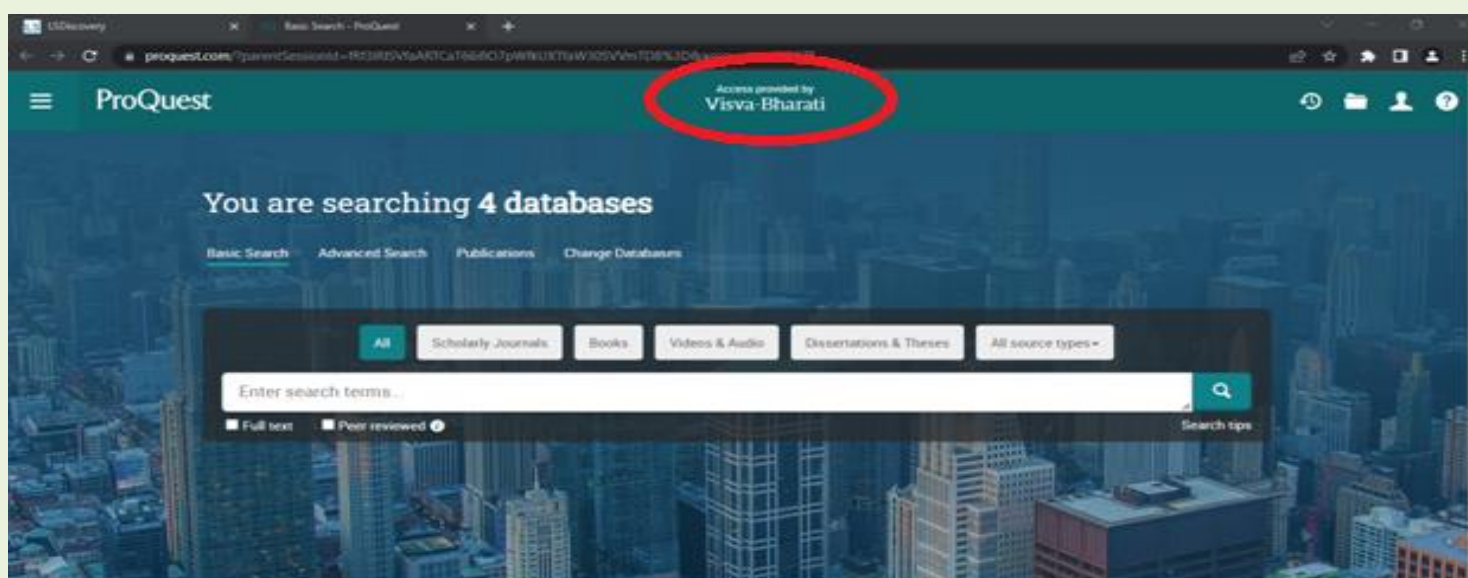
Access to ProQuest through LSDiscovery

ProQuest collections span centuries of newspapers, dissertations, journals, primary sources, video, ebooks and more to ensure access to varied content types and deep datasets. By partnering with ProQuest, libraries empower researchers to analyze every aspect and angle of complex topics. And, together with powerful text and data mining tools, uncover insights that could lead to important breakthroughs.

Content discovery is an integral part of the ProQuest platform's goal of driving better research outcomes for subscribing organizations and their users. An organization's ProQuest content is discoverable through Summon and Ex Libris Primo Central. You can also link to ProQuest from Google Scholar and PubMed. When available, researchers can find and use their organization's ProQuest ebook holdings alongside their ProQuest platform database content. Similarly, Academic Video Online (AVON) subscribers can also now discover and use their video content while searching the ProQuest platform databases or even selecting to search AVON on its own within the ProQuest platform.



The ProQuest platform is multidisciplinary and multi-content type: scholarly journals, books, videos & audio, dissertations & theses, newspapers, Historical Newspapers, Magazines, Trade Journals, Reports, Wire feeds, Blogs, Podcasts & Websites... All video content in your ProQuest collections may be isolated by selecting Videos & Audio in Basic Search before running a search. Doing this will not, however, exclusively isolate Academic Video Online content. It will search all content within your ProQuest collections indexed as video content, including Academic Video Online.

All book content in your ProQuest collections may be isolated by selecting Books in Basic Search before running a search. However, this will not exclusively isolate ebook Central content. It will search all content within your ProQuest collections indexed as book content, including ebook Central. Search mechanism in ProQuest: Successful searching is largely about being precise.

The tips, techniques, and information here can help you search with precision and find what you need.

- ✚ Your search terms can include any letters or numbers. Because ProQuest search supports the UTF-8 character set, managed by the Unicode Consortium, you can enter your terms in English, or any other language, such as French, Spanish, Greek, Cyrillic, etc. Whether your search retrieves any documents will depend on matching content or indexing being available in ProQuest.
- ✚ ProQuest ignores punctuation characters — such as periods, commas, and colons — in your search terms.
- ✚ **Stop words:** When processing your search, some search engines ignore very common words you may have included, so-called 'stop words' — like articles (a, an, the) and prepositions (from, with, of). These engines will only search for those words if you somehow flag or mark them in your search, often by enclosing them in parentheses or sometimes with brackets. ProQuest does not recognize any list of 'stop words.' For example, if you search for 'cat in the hat,' ProQuest will search for 'cat AND in AND the AND hat.' The default relevance sorting of your results will bring documents that contain all of your search terms — mostly as 'cat in the hat' — to the top of your results list.
- ✚ **Diaccritical marks:** Indexing and content terms carrying diaccritical marks, like umlauts (Ä) or accents, can inconsistently carry the mark, or not. Because of that inconsistency, ProQuest ignores these marks. For example, a search for the word für

(Danish for 'before') will not only retrieve for, but will also retrieve all records containing för, fór, and fôr. A search for any of these terms will retrieve the same results.

Some special characters are always going to be interpreted in the context of specific kinds of searching:

- ✚ Greater than (>) and less than (<) symbols are reserved for date searching.
- ✚ Brackets and parentheses are used to build 'nested' queries. For example:
cow AND (dog OR cat)
If you use them with any other intent, your search is unlikely to retrieve what you expected.
- ✚ The slash (/) is reserved for use with proximity operators, as in PRE/4.

Read more about special characters below.

- ✚ Broaden your search - separate your search terms with OR.
 - ✚ Narrow your search - separate your search terms with AND.
- Note: By default, ProQuest assumes an AND relationship between your search terms.
- ✚ Advanced Search - look for terms in specific fields used to index documents in ProQuest.
 - ✚ Target your search more precisely - move your cursor over the Advanced Search link to display a menu offering both Advanced Search, and Command Line.
 - ✚ Publication Search - browse issues of a newspaper, journal, or magazine -- or search for articles in specific publications.
 - ✚ Phrase searching - look for phrases by enclosing them in quotation marks, for example, "healthy eating".
 - ✚ Word variants - to retrieve only a particular variant of a word, such as colour but not color, enter the word in quotation marks in the search box, for example: "colour".
 - ✚ Limit your search - select available limiter check boxes such as Full text or Peer-reviewed to focus your search.
- Note: Available limiters vary by database and search method.

ProQuest software tools help libraries put the spotlight on researchers and their accomplishments. Researchers can connect and collaborate with peers, discover funding opportunities and be part of the scholarly ecosystem. Other solutions support dissemination of the valuable research output of academic institutions.

Some Recent Library Activities / Developments:

- **Three-Day Special Session:** Visva-Bharati Library Network has successfully organized three special sessions in Physical mode during 20-22 February 2023. The sessions have been arranged to enhance the research/publications skills for the quality of research output. Topics covered during the session are 1) **VBLN as Research Intermediaries by Dr Koushik Ghosh, Assistant Librarian (Stage-II) and In-charge, Journal Section, and Dr. Nimai Chand Saha, University Librarian (Acting);** 2) **Mendley: The Open Source Reference Management Software by Dr. Sabahat Nausheen, Assistant Librarian (Stage-II), Rabindra Bhavana Library and 3) Issues on Publication Ethics by Dr. Partha Pratim Ray, Deputy Librarian and In-charge PSB Library, Visva-Bharati.** The number of participants was Twenty-two (22), Eighteen (18) and Thirty (30) respectively on the first day, second day and third day. Participants were pleased to attend the sessions and opined that the sessions were helpful for the research/publications work. Participants are also pleased to request to arrange similar types of program in future to support research and academic activities.
- **Library Orientation Program:** on Resources, Services, and Facilities, followed by a demonstration of the library website and a physical visit of the library with entire satisfaction, has been arranged on;
 - a) 09 February 2023 for the students of the Center of Modern European Languages, Literatures and Culture Studies (CMELLCS), Bhasha-Bhavana, Visva-Bharati. A total of 80 students from different programs (UG, PG) and two faculty members have joined the program. The students expressed their satisfaction during interaction on this Orientation Program.
 - b) 06 January 2023 for the students of the Department of English, Bhasha-Bhavana, Visva-Bharati. A total of 104 students from different programs (UG, PG, M. Phil, and Ph.D.) and one faculty member have joined the program. The students expressed their satisfaction during interaction on this Orientation Program. *[Not reported on January 2023].*
- **Fire Drilling Program:** To strengthen the awareness of actions to be taken during fire-emergency call, a fire drilling program has been arranged on 13 February 2023 at 11.30am with the assistance of the existing AMC service provider of the Fire Extinguishers. There was total twenty-seven staff including staff from Watch & Ward. The program was highly needful, as opined by the staff after the participation.
- **Similarity Checking through OURIGINAL (supported by Turnitin):** Total twenty-two articles/ files have been checked by the academics and library.
- **Documents / Article Delivery Services:** During the month 14 no. of soft copies of the articles have been collected and delivered through mail as requested by the academics/scholars.
