

# "Research Publication Ethics" as Common course: Scholars' response

As per Notification of Visva-Bharati, a six-day common course work on the paper "Research Publication Ethics" for Ph.D. scholars of Visva-Bharati was conducted during 14-20 March 2023 (10 am – 5.30 pm) through blended mode under the Coordinatorship of the University Librarian(Acting), Visva-Bharati. One hundred forty-two research scholars (142) from different disciplines attended the course out of 147 scholars enrolled in various departments of Visva-Bharati in the academic session 2022-23. Two faculty members, namely Dr. Ipsita Sarkar, Department of Philosophy & Religion, Vidya Bhavana, and Prof. Sudhansu Sekhar Maity, Department of Statistics, Siksha Bhavana, along with eight library officers of Visva-Bharati Library Network, namely Dr. Nimai Chand Saha, Dr. Partha Pratim Ray, Dr. Tapas Kumar Das, Sri Ajay Kumar Sharma, Dr. Sabahat Nausheen, Dr. Sanat Bhattacharya, Dr. Koushik Ghosh, and Sri Pradip Hembram took the classes for the said course.


In the teaching-learning process, student feedback plays an important role in measuring teaching quality as it helps to improve services depending on stakeholders' satisfaction levels. In view of the above, online feedback responses through 'Google Form' [Link: https://forms.gle/GuZD9po9rJx9FMks8] were collected from the above-said course participants. Consequently, a five-point scale feedback form on the teaching-learning process was circulated and received 137 scholars' feedback. All the responses on different aspects are presented below.



The responses of different participants on the question of how much of the syllabi were focused on in the class by the teachers. It was seen that the majority of 64.23 percent of participants opined as outstanding with the focus on syllabi, and 32.12 percent of scholars rated it as good. Only 3.65 percent responded as fair. Notably, no respondent rated it as poor.


The diagram on the right side portrays the scholars' responses to the teacher's self-confidence while taking classes. It was observed that 91 (66.42%) participants responded as outstanding to the question on the teacher's self-confidence. In contrast, 41 (29.93%) scholars said the teacher's confidence was good, and four said it was fair. It was also noticed that only 1 (0.73%) participant rated as poor.





The 3D pie chart on the left side explains the responses of the scholars on the teacher's presentation and communication skills. It was found that 87 (63.5%) participants said that the teacher's presentation and communication skills were outstanding, and 43 (31.39%) of them felt that the communication skills of the teacher were good. Whereas 6 (4.38%) scholars responded as fair, only 1 (0.73%) respondent opined that the teacher's presentation and communication skills were poor.

The pie chart on the right side depicts the responses of the scholars on teachers' classroom discussions. It was noticed that 62.77 percent of scholars said that classroom discussions were outstanding, and 32.85 percent responded as good. However, 3.65 percent of participants rated it as fair, and notably, only 0.73 percent of the respondent said the teacher's classroom discussion was poor.




This feedback report provides an opportunity to understand the scholars' perceptions on the teachers of the course. Thus, this study is helpful to the course coordinator in mapping the future plan to develop the teaching-learning process.




Annual Reviews publications are among the highest cited publications by impact factor according to the Journal Citation Reports published by Thomson Reuters.

# **SEARCH TIPS:** Annual Reviews Search Functionality

- \* Boolean and Advanced Searching: You may constrain your search query on the Annual Reviews site using Boolean operators and modifiers or the search interface fields. These include:
  - ♣ Boolean Search Operator: AND: The AND operator will limit your search such that only articles containing all of the terms will be included in the search results.
  - Boolean Search Operator: OR: The OR operator will return search results for either term used in a search query.
  - 🖶 Boolean Search Operator: NOT: The NOT operator is used to exclude terms from your search.
- \* Searching for authors: To search for multiple authors, separate each author name with either AND or OR. Using AND will search for content that has been co-authored by the authors. Using OR will search for content that has been authored by either of the authors.
- \* Searching for phrases: Enclose your search term with quotation marks to search for an exact match of that phrase. Without quotation marks, articles including all of the search terms somewhere in the article will be listed.
- \* Wildcards: Use a question mark (?) in a search term to represent any one character and use an asterisk (\*) to represent zero or more characters.
- \* Constraining Your Search by Content Type: You may constrain your search query using the dropdown menu on the lefthand side of the search field.

You can search anywhere, in the Article Title, by Author, by Cited Author, by Keywords, within the article Abstract, or by Author Affiliation.
