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Six-Day National Level online Workshop on UKOAS-2024

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### Six-Day National Level online Workshop on “Unlocking Knowledge: Open Access Solutions (UKOAS-2024)”

Visva-Bharati Library Network organized a Six-Day National Level online Workshop on “Unlocking Knowledge: Open Access Solutions” (UKOAS-2024) during 19-24 February 2024 to answer the growing demand for librarians and information specialists to adopt open access principles and manage the shifting environment of scholarly communication. This Workshop aims to enhance the skills of library professionals and others in the effective use of open-access software and to promote an open culture inside their organizations.

**Day-I (19/02/2024):** The Inaugural Session began with the Vedic Hymns performed by *Sangeet Bhavana*, followed by a Welcome Address delivered by the Organizing Secretary, UKOAS-2024 & Librarian, Visva-Bharati, *Dr. Nimai Chand Saha*, followed by the Inaugural Address by *Prof. Sanjoy Kumar Mallik*, Hon’ble Vice-Chancellor, Visva-Bharati. *Prof. Narendra Labkar*, Retired Professor, DLISc, Gauhati University, Guwahati, and President, IASLIC, delivered the Address as a Guest of Honour at this event. *Dr. Sangeeta Kaul*, Director of DELNET, delivered a Keynote Address titled “Adapting Open Mantra in Libraries for harnessing knowledge” that covered the central theme of the Workshop. She touched upon the important areas and aspects of the Open access solutions in her address. *Dr. Sanat Bhattacharya*, Assistant Librarian, Siksha-Bhavana Library, Visva-Bharati, offered a word of thanks.

Before starting the Technical Session, *Dr. Tapas Kumar Das*, Joint Organizing Secretary, UKOAS-2024, & Deputy Librarian, Visva-Bharati, introduced the Workshop before the participants. 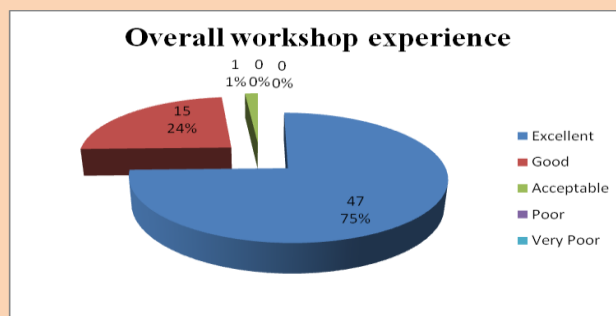

The Workshop was concluded by Ashram Sangeet.

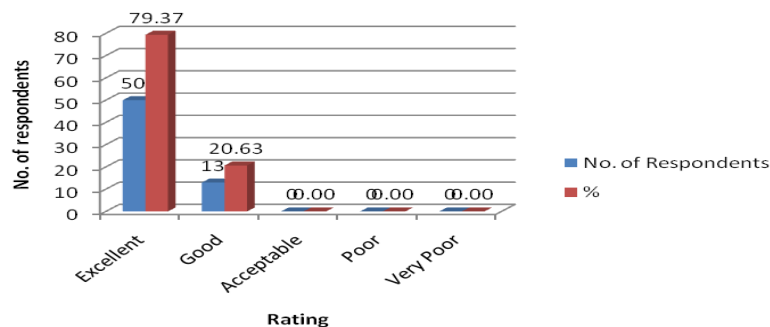
The registration link was open for 20 days, and 51 participants from different academic levels, like students, research scholars, and faculty members, registered themselves from different disciplines. Among them, 31 were male, and the remaining 20 were female participants from 14 states of India. Out of the total, 40 participants were from the Library and Information Science disciplines, and the remaining 12 were from other domains. About half of the participants were working professionals; the rest were students or research scholars.

On the last day (19.02.2024), a link to the feedback form was circulated among the participants to examine the participants’ views on the Workshop regarding the resource persons, content of the Workshop, etc. The response was very positive and encouraging. It was seen that 12 (Twelve) more people were showing interest in this Workshop besides registered participants. Therefore, a total of 63 (sixty-three) participants submitted their opinions regarding the Workshop by filling out the feedback form, and they (63) have been considered to analyze their valuable feedback and presented here.

**Overall workshop :** Out of the 63 participants, it is seen from the pie chart that the highest number of respondents, 75 percent (47 participants) found it excellent, nearly 24 percent (15 participants) remarked it good, and very few (1.59%) respondents rated it acceptable. No respondent rated it poor or very poor.



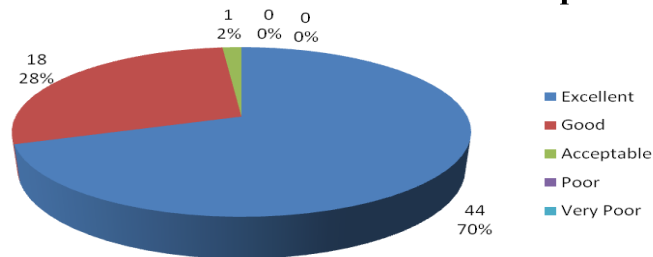
### Views on Resource Persons



**Resource Persons:** The bar diagram given at the left side shows the participants' views on the resource persons of the Workshop. It reveals that the maximum number of participants in the Workshop, more than 79 percent (50 participants), found the resource person of the Workshop excellent, followed by the rating as good (20.63%).

**Contents of the Workshop :** Further, out of the total respondents, it is seen from the pie chart given right side that about 70 percent (forty-four) responded that the content of the Workshop was excellent, followed by a total number of 18 (28%) participants who found it good, and only one (1.59%) remarked it acceptable.

### Views on contents of the Workshop



**Objectives Clearance:** It is also seen from the responses of the participants that more than 57 percent (thirty-six) of the participants marked that the objectives of the Workshop was very much clear, followed by 38.9% (twenty-four) found it clear, and a few respondents with 4.8% (3) rated it acceptable.

*The participation certificate was given only to those registered members who attended the workshop satisfactorily.*

#### A. Having VB domain mail ID (xxx.yyy@visva-bharati.ac.in)

**Step 1:** Go to [www.grammarly.com/edu](http://www.grammarly.com/edu) (mandatory to sign up for this URL)

**Step 2:** Click on Join Your Organization button, fill up the self-service form. Ensure that users are registering from their respective official email id (@visva-bharati.ac.in)

**Step 3:** After clicking signup, an activation email will be sent to the user's institutional email ID.

**Please Note:** Your @edu credential verification has been activated and an activation email will be sent to the user's institutional email ID once he/she registers. Users may at times get this in Spam/Junk/Promotion/Update Folder due to mail setting - users are advised to check the spam folder in case the link is not received in the INBOX.

**Step 4:** Kindly Verify the activation mail from Grammarly. Once registered, users will land on the 'Grammarly Editor', which is easy to use and can be explored by the user. The MS Word Plugin can be downloaded from the support page after registration from the link.

**Step 5:** Kindly use access code: 'riyCsWRtFoazgotP' for registration.
