Researchers' knowledge and comprehension of the issue are increased when they use this tool to find new sources that are relevant to their study topic.

Google Scholar's "Related Articles" tool suggests other articles that are closely linked to the topic after evaluating the content of the article the user is presently viewing. These suggestions are based on the authors, journals, and other sources that are cited in the article, as well as the keywords and phrases that are used in the piece.

6. Google Scholar Metrics: Google Scholar Metrics give authors a simple way to rapidly assess the impact and visibility of recent articles in academic journals. Scholar metrics help authors decide where to publish their new research by compiling recent citations to numerous publications.

To see which articles in a publication were cited the most and who cited them, click on its h-index number to view the articles as well as the citations underlying the metrics. One can also explore publications in research areas of your interest.

7. Settings in Google Scholar: One can set preferences for search results, Languages, Library links, Account, and Browser extensions.

**7.1 Search results:** One can customize view of search results in per page. Google's default (10 results) provides the fastest results which can be changed to 20 results per page also.

Whether user can view each search result in the same page or want to open a new bowser window for each selected results. They can set the preferences to show download the bibliography managers or turn it off. Not only that, they can also set the specific bibliography manager (like BibText, EndNote, Refman, and Refwork) in which all search results will download.

Users can set the preferences to search the pages written in any language or in particular any language also.

**7.3 Library links:** Google Scholar allows to connect search results to library's holdings through remote access, so that you can access the full text of articles made available by your institutional subscriptions.



In Settings, there is an option for Library Links on the left-hand side. Enter University/ Institution name in the search box, and press the magnifying glass to search. Select University/ Institution when it appears. This ensures that search results will include links to the databases in the University/ Institution collection that have full text copies of the articles discover.

8. Searching in Google Scholar: Google Scholar offers an easy-to-use platform for accessing scholarly literature, allowing researchers to search across diverse sources like journal articles, books, theses, and conference papers. It streamlines research by consolidating searches and is especially valuable for locating open-access content free from paywalls.

Within Google Scholar one may conduct searches by keyword, author and article title. Search results are normally sorted by relevance, not by date. To find newer articles, try the following options in the left sidebar:

- 4 click "Since Year" to show only recently published papers, sorted by relevance;
- click "Sort by date" to show just the new additions, sorted by date;
- + click the envelope icon to have new results periodically delivered by email.

One can access Advanced Search option by clicking the dropdown menu symbol in the upper left corner [ $\equiv$ ] and choosing "Advanced Search". In Advanced Search one has the ability to narrow or broaden ones search by searching for ones key terms or phrases anywhere in the article, or in the title of the article. One may also choose to limit ones search by author, publication or date range.
